PPL Montour Preserve to Host 2010 Pennsylvania Envirothon

PPL, a long-time friend and supporter of the Pennsylvania Envirothon, is hosting the 2010 State competition at its Montour Preserve site on Wednesday, May 26th .

Nestled in a broad valley in the Appalachian foothills of north central Pennsylvania, PPL Montour Preserve is surrounded by two long, rolling ridges—Montour Ridge to the south and Muncy Hills to the north. PPL chose this low-lying valley, with its favorable environmental and economic conditions, as the site for the Montour power plant.

Built in 1972, the coal-fired power plant is located three miles south of the preserve.



In the center of the preserve is 165-acre Lake Chillisquaque, developed to provide a backup reservoir of cooling water for the power plant. The preserve now offers a variety of educational and recreational opportunities, including

hiking, nature observation, photography, birding, boating, and fishing, as well as hunting nearby.

The preserve is located in Montour County four miles northeast of Washingtonville, PA, and is accessible from Route 54.

Rules & Regulations Revised

For consistency and clarity, the Pennsylvania Envirothon Board of Directors updated its Rules & Regulations. Most of the revisions pertain to how county conservation districts or sponsoring organizations set up their events. The revisions that directly affect teams, of which teachers should be aware, include the following:

The previous Rules & Regulations stated, "Teams must consist of no fewer than three (3) and no more than five (5) members in order to participate." The current rules now state, "Teams must consist of five (5) members in order to participate in the Pennsylvania State Envirothon. All members must represent the same educational unit." This was revised in order to be consistent with the following rule: "The team representing Pennsylvania at the Canon Envirothon must consist of five (5) team members and two (2) adult advisors/chaperones."

He never hesitated to share ideas during our board meetings and never missed an opportunity to talk about Envirothon with his peers.

Don remains active in conservation by serving as a director for the Mifflin County Conservation District as well as volunteering with many community organizations. Don, we'll miss you and we wish you the very best in all that you do.

Running an Envirothon Competition on the Cheap!

Does the current fiscal situation have you in a jam? Are you wondering how to pull off your local Envirothon competition at a time when your purse strings are being cut? Well, the Fulton/Franklin County competition has been run for quite a few years on what most would consider a shoestring budget. Granted, we don't have a lot of bells and whistles and every team doesn't go home loaded down with goodies, but we conduct a competition, reward the top teams, and send our respective winning State teams to the competition.

From the Fulton County perspective: We historically have not solicited major sponsors for our event. Part of that decision was philosophical, but a larger part is that Fulton County flat out does not have much business/industry from which to solicit assistance. We have, over the years, been able to

obtain "awards", in the shape of savings bonds, for the first place team from our local bank(s). The first place team members also receive a Tshirt. These are purchased through Environmental Education funds. Those funds raised through Conservation District's yearly tree sale. While many Counties provide T-shirts to all participants, Fulton County does not - as noted, only to the winning team. The top three teams receive medallions, which are also paid for out of the **Environmental Education** fund. The only other cost that the District incurs is for food/ drink the day of the competition, and that is for cooperating agencies staff only, not for student participants. However, a small snack is provided to students late in the morning during the competition. Schools are asked to bring their own lunches. Given that both Fulton and Franklin County hold their competition together, we are able to split the cost of providing lunch, snacks, etc. to our staff and cooperating agency folks.

From the Franklin County perspective: In Franklin County, the budget item under Envirothon was always very low. However, we always managed to put on a first rate event on a "shoestring" budget. We never set out to solicit sponsors for our event - it just sort of fell into our Valley Quarries, Inc. laps. contacted me about providing awards at our local Envirothon. Thanks to Valley Quarries' offer, our first place team members each receive a \$100 savings bond. added bonus is that Valley Quarries also provides their Public Relations officer to attend our event and he takes the photos and does the news release for both Franklin and Fulton Counties. Two years ago, we fell into

another wonderful offer. Adams Electric Cooperative, contacted me offered a check for \$500 to help defray expenses to supply each participant with a T-shirt. As many of you know, \$500 was not going to cover those costs. Again, Valley Quarries stepped in and provided more financial assistance for us to buy Tshirts. We have truly been blessed by the generosity of these two companies Adams Electric Cooperative, Inc. and Valley Quarries, Inc.

Never had a joint Envirothon with a neighboring county??? There are many benefits to doing this: (1) cuts the costs of the event in half, (2) provides more manpower at the event, and (3) the best thing of all – lightens the workload of preparing for the event. In light of the current economy, this is something all of you might want to consider for 2010.

Establishing a Middle School/Elementary Envirothon

Since the late 1970's, Pennsylvania's county conservation districts have provided an Envirothon program for thousands of high school-aged students. Now because of the success of this natural resource, conservation, environmental education team-oriented competition, many middle school and elementary teachers are catching the Envirothon buzz and would like to get involved.

But, who to call first...is the number one question faced by teachers who want to get information about or become involved in an Envirothon program, at any level. Since the Envirothon is a conservation district led program in most counties, the first call should go to your local county conservation district. Contact information can found in your local phone directory or by visiting the Pennsylvania Envirothon website – Contacts page: http://www.envirothonpa.org/Contact-Us.shtml.

Your county conservation district can provide you with information about the different levels of Envirothon programs they offer. If they don't organize an event for a lower grade level, perhaps with some encouragement, they will consider it. At the high school level, resource guides and reference materials are provided, free of charge, for county Envirothon events by the Pennsylvania State Envirothon. Conservation districts that organize lower level Envirothon programs develop and provide study references and resource guides specifically designed for their county's event.

Many counties have found that the advantage to having multiple age groups is more students get exposed to the Envirothon at an earlier age and continue to move up in the ranks. These enhanced skills encourage the potential of becoming a state winner, even a North American champion. If you are interested in how to get involved in an Envirothon program, please call your county conservation district.
