#### University of Pittsburgh Johnstown to host 2012 Pennsylvania Envirothon

The 2012 Pennsylvania Envirothon will be held on Tuesday, May 22nd and Wednesday, May 23rd at the University of Pittsburgh Johnstown (UPJ), Cambria County.

The oral component will take place on Tuesday and the station testing on Wednesday. All events will be held on the UPJ campus.

UPJ is located in a suburb of Johnstown, 70 miles east of Pittsburgh. UPJ is a four-year fully accredited, degreegranting, coeducational, residential

undergraduate college, which was founded in 1927 as a regional campus of the University of Pittsburgh, one of the nation's oldest institutions of higher education.

Envirothon teams staying on campus will be housed in the University's modern Living/Learning Conference Center and newly renovated Residence Halls.

Teams that have completed their oral presentations may want to make arrangements to visit the historical Johnstown Flood Museum or Inclined

Plane. You may also join in on a pick-up game of basketball or soccer on the outdoor courts, or hike on the campus's nature trails.

Tuesday evening following dinner and the completion of the oral component, there will be an organized activity focusing on geocaching followed by an ice cream social.

#### Where are they now? An Envirothon Alumni Story

Alligators, armadillos and fire ants! These were some of the animals I encountered in Mississippi during my first trip to the Canon Envirothon in 2001. The flora and fauna there were just a little bit different from what I was used to seeing in northwestern Pennsylvania where I grew up.

When I first joined the Envirothon team during my sophomore year of high school, I was excited to have the opportunity to learn with my friends from Boy Scouts about the forests and waterways where we were spending most of our spare time camping, hunting and fishing. My Envirothon experience quickly evolved from learning simple facts about wildlife, forestry, soils and aquatics to mastering concepts of environmental science and natural resource management. The current issue that year was urban non-point source pollution so I had to think about how human activity affects ecosystems and possible solutions to problems while considering all environmental, political, economic and societal impacts. What is most valuable about Envirothon is that it teaches how to solve complex contemporary problems by applying scientific knowledge and considering all possible solutions to the problems.

After graduating from high school, I knew I wanted to pursue a career related to resource management. Envirothon taught me that many resource issues revolve around human use and impact on the environment so I chose the energy sector, in particular nuclear engineering, where I could have a positive influence on society by finding cleaner and more efficient ways to produce energy. Throughout my career, I have studied many interesting areas including reactor safety, nuclear waste management and new reactor technologies. Envirothon gave me the skill set needed to analyze these complex issues.

For all of the current Envirothon students, please take advantage of the opportunities Envirothon provides to learn something new and cool about your environment. Age a deer skull or measure the DBH of your favorite tree. When you pursue your careers, whether it is in a traditional environmental science field such as forestry and wildlife biology or other areas like engineering, business or law, take your environmental knowledge and passion with you. Remember that Envirothon tests are not taken behind a desk or a computer, they are taken out in the woods, in the soil pit and in the streams. Don't be afraid to get your boots muddy when tackling the hard issues!

#### **Opportunities to Explore the Outdoors**

**ECO Camp—Exploring Careers Outdoors** — Eco Camp, Exploring Careers Outdoors, is a week-long residential camp for high school students focusing on outdoor careers in recreation, conservation and natural resources. Professional staff from DCNR including state parks, geology, and forestry, act as counselors and educators, exposing students to a variety of careers and outdoor recreation activities while



interacting with students on a daily basis. The camp is held the second week of July and is open to high school students in grades 10—12. Students attend free of charge and are selected by a committee based on their applications, essays, and recommendations. Rivers Conservation & Fly Fishing Youth Camp — Applications are now being accepted for the 18th annual Rivers Conservation and Fly Fishing Youth Camp. At the camp, students are exposed to the challenges and the rewards that protecting these fragile ecosystems can produce. Between the in-depth instruction that they receive from experts in various environmental fields and the hands-on project that they complete on the stream, the students will understand the importance of their continued involvement in coldwater conservation. The camp is open to students between the ages of 14 and 17. The 32 students will be selected through an application process where they must state why they want to attend camp and they must provide a reference from a science teacher or guidance counselor. #### **2012 Oral Component Information for the State Competition**

The oral component presentation is mandatory for all teams, and the score will be combined with the testing part of the event to decide the overall winning team. The oral component will be one-sixth of the overall score. In the case of a tie, the Current Issue test score will determine the placement for the final scores in the Envirothon.

The oral component scenario will be posted on the Pennsylvania Envirothon website (www.envirothonpa.org) on Wednesday, May 16th, the week prior to

the event. This will provide those winning teams an opportunity to prepare for the oral presentation. Teams will be able to utilize existing resources, research new information, and obtain input and guidance from advisors to enhance their presentation. In addition, posting it on the web will also allow those nonparticipating teams a chance to see how the scenario is written, what is expected, and provide an opportunity to "participate" on their own, in preparation for future State Envirothon events or for their own personal growth.
