**Certifications must be provided by the Department of Human Services. Certifications from other institutions or organizations will not be accepted as per University of Pittsburgh policy.

Volunteer Responsibilities for the Pennsylvania Envirothon

The volunteer positions are listed below along with a general description of responsibilities. In addition, time commitment required for each position is noted.

TUESDAY VOLUNTEERS – May 21, 2019

<u>Oral Component Judge</u> – As a judge you will receive a copy of the problem scenario and a copy of the same resource material the students receive. You will receive this information about two weeks prior to the event. At the event and upon reporting for the mandatory judges training, you will receive an overview of the Oral Component, you will be grouped into a five person judging team, and you will receive training on how to be a judge for the event. Members of the PA Envirothon Board will review your role as a judge, review the problem scenario the students received, review the score sheet and how to use it. They will also go over what types of questions the judges should be asking the students.

Listed below are some of the particulars of what and how the event will occur.

- The teams will have a timed 20-minute Oral Component session.
- The team may use up to 7 minutes for the actual presentation to the judges.
- The judges will then ask questions for the remaining allotted time.
- The team will be judged and scored on their knowledge, presentation skills, and reaction to the questions.

Time commitment – A mandatory training is required for this position, which begins promptly at 10:00 a.m. It is recommended that you report by 9:50 a.m. and prepare to stay until 6:00 p.m. (*If you are willing to stay later to accommodate a team(s) that is running late due to unforeseen circumstances, please indicate this on the registration form.* One to two panels of judges will be formed to assist the Pennsylvania Envirothon if such a situation occurs. Such judges will be asked to stay no later than 6:30 p.m.)

<u>Presentation Room Timer</u> – At the event and upon reporting for presentation room timer training you will receive an overview of the Oral Component and the problem scenario the students received. You will also receive training and instructions on your duties from PA Envirothon Board members.

Listed below are some of the particulars of your duties and schedule of events.

- You will be assigned to a presentation room and will be the person in charge of such room.
- You will run the clock and start and stop the teams during their presentations.
- You will make sure the judges complete ALL of the required information on their score sheets.
- You will collect the score sheets.

Time commitment – It is recommended that you report by 10:45 a.m. and prepare to stay until 6:00 p.m.

<u>Team Buddy</u> – At the event and upon reporting for oral component team buddy training, you will receive an overview of the Oral Component and be assigned to oversee specific teams through their preparation period. You will receive training and instructions on your duties from PA Envirothon Board members.

Listed below are some of the particulars of your duties and schedule of events:

- You will be asked to assist with checking in teams, directing and escorting them to the correct room/building for preparation and presentation.
- You will serve as the team's prep room monitor.
- At the end of the one-hour prep time you will escort the team to its presentation room.
- Once the team is delivered to its assigned presentation room, you will report to Oral Component Registration and collect another team to start the process again.
- Team buddies should bring along a book, magazine, something to keep busy and occupy time.
- You will review the oral component rules and regulations with each team.

Time commitment – It is recommended that you report by 10:30 a.m. and prepare to stay until 5:00 p.m.

*All **Tuesday** volunteers should report for orientation and instruction at their designated time to the registration area located in the UPJ Student Union Building. **PLEASE BE ON TIME.** Lunch is provided for all volunteers.

WEDNESDAY VOLUNTEERS - May 22, 2019

<u>Station Travel Official</u> – At the station testing, you will receive instructions from PA Envirothon Board members. As a station travel official you will be responsible for a group of teams. You will move them from station to station; accompany team members to restroom; monitor the group for any inconsistencies; etc. This responsibility requires a lot of walking with some hills to maneuver.

Time commitment – It is recommended that you report by 8:00 a.m. and prepare to stay until 4:30 p.m.

<u>Food Service Volunteer</u> – You will receive instructions from PA Envirothon Board members. As food service volunteers, you will be responsible to assist with the delivery of coffee, water, and lunch for all participants to all stations. You will also assist in setting up an afternoon snack for the participants. This will require some lifting and walking. Volunteers must be able to lift/carry up to 40 lbs.

Time commitment – It is recommended that you report by 7:30 a.m. and prepare to stay until 4:30 p.m.

<u>Oral Component Scorer</u> – You will receive instructions from PA Envirothon Board members. As oral component scorers, you will be responsible to assist with tabulating the oral presentation scores from Tuesday's team presentations. This will require sitting, tabulating scores from the score sheets, and double checking math.

Time commitment – It is recommended that you report by 8:30 a.m. and prepare to stay until 1:30 p.m.

*All **Wednesday** volunteers should report for instruction at their designated time to the registration area located at the Windber Recreation Park. **PLEASE BE ON TIME.** Lunch is provided for all volunteers.

Pennsylvania Volunteer Certifications

General Information

According to the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services, certification for volunteer requirement begins August 25, 2015 and must be renewed every 60 months.

- Adult Volunteers are defined as:
 - Being responsible for the welfare of children; or
 - Having direct volunteer contact with children (care, supervision, guidance or control to children AND routine interaction)
- Must obtain Pennsylvania State Police Criminal History and Child Abuse History Certifications
- FBI Federal Criminal History Certification not required as long as:
 - o Position is unpaid
 - PA resident continuously for the past 10 years
 - Signs a disclaimer affirming no charges in other states that would prohibit selections as a volunteer

Pennsylvania Envirothon Volunteers include, but are not limited to the following: team advisors, coaches, and chaperones, staff, and event volunteers.

<u>Copies of the following certifications must be submitted to the Pennsylvania Envirothon prior to being</u> <u>considered as an Envirothon volunteer.</u>

- Pennsylvania State Police Criminal History Clearance Can be obtained at https://epatch.state.pa.us
- Child Abuse History Clearance Can be obtained at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis
- FBI Background Check Exemption, if qualified.
 - Volunteer qualifies if he/she has been a resident of the Commonwealth of PA for the entirety of the previous 10 years AND has never been convicted of a disqualifying offense.
 - UPJ Exemption form is provided for signature.
- FBI Federal Criminal History Clearance
 - *Only required if the volunteer does not qualify for exemption from FBI Background Check
 - Cost: \$27.50
 - Can be obtained at https://uenroll.identogo.com/
 - Service codes: Volunteer (1KG6ZJ), Employee (1KG756)
 - Additional service codes can be found at <u>http://www.dhs.pa.gov/citizens/clearancesbackgroundchecks/</u>

When assisting with the Pennsylvania Envirothon, certifications must be less than one (1) year old and must be renewed every 60 months from the date on your oldest certification. The applicant or employee is responsible for paying any cost associated with obtaining the certifications. Please black out social security numbers if they are displayed on any of the forms.

PACKING LIST - WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING TO THE ENVIROTHON?

Packing List (if staying at the University of Pittsburgh Johnstown) – Every effort has been made to provide you with a packing list; however, individual needs/preferences should be considered.

The following LINENS are provided: two sheets, a blanket, pillow, and a pillowcase. You will need to bring your own towels.

<u>From Eastern, Southern or Western Points</u>: Take PA Turnpike (Route 76) to Somerset Exit (Old Exit #10). From Somerset, take Route 219 North to the Geistown/Elton Exit, PA Route 756. Make a right off the exit, then another right onto Theatre Drive. Follow signs to campus.

<u>Alternate route from Eastern or Southern Points:</u> PA Turnpike (Route 76) to Bedford Exit (Old Exit #11). At exit, turn left on Business Route 220, and then left again onto Route 220 (I-99) North towards Altoona. Exit on to Route 56 West. Follow Route 56 for approximately 30 miles until you reach a traffic light near the community of Windber. Continue on Route 56 for about 3 miles until you come to a traffic light at Theatre Drive. Make a right onto Theatre Drive. Follow signs to campus.

<u>From Directly Northern Points</u>: Take Route 219 South to the Geistown/Elton Exit, PA Route 756 (Note: do not take the Johnstown Expressway exit). At the traffic light (bottom of exit ramp) turn left onto Route 756. At the second traffic light turn right onto Theatre Drive. Follow signs to campus.

DIRECTIONS TO THE WINDBER RECREATION PARK – WEDNESDAY EVENTS

Windber Recreation Park 160 Rec Road Windber, PA

<u>From UPJ</u>: Start out going east on Schoolhouse Rd toward Picking Dr. 1.3 miles. Turn right onto Elton Rd/PA-756. University Park Church of God is on the right 0.9 mile. Take the 1st right onto Forest Hills Drive/PA-160. Forest Hills Drive is just past Post Street 3.0 miles. Turn sharp left onto Rec Road. Rec Road is 0.3 miles past Hoffman Farm Road. If you are on PA-160 and reach Gilda Dr you've gone about 0.1 miles too far. Follow Pennsylvania Envirothon signs.

<u>From Route 56 West:</u> At the traffic light turn slight right onto 21st St/PA-160. Subway Restaurant is on the corner. 21st St is 0.2 miles past 24th St. Stock's 50 Six Pac is on the corner. If you reach 19th St you've gone about 0.1 miles too far 0.3 miles. Turn left onto Graham Ave/PA-160. Graham Ave is just past Jackson Ave. D'arc's Pizza Shop is on the corner. If you reach Somerset Ave you've gone a little too far 0.8 mile. Turn right onto 9th St/PA-160. Martella's Pharmacy is on the corner. Continue to follow PA-160 (up a hill). PA-160 is just past 10th St. If you reach 8th St you've gone a little too far 0.7 mile. Turn slight right onto Rec Road. If you reach Hoffman Farm Rd you've gone about 0.3 miles too far.

<u>From Route 56 East:</u> At the traffic light turn left onto 21st St/PA-160. Subway Restaurant is on the corner. 21st St is 0.2 miles past 24th St. Stock's 50 Six Pac is on the corner. If you reach 19th St you've gone about 0.1 miles too far 0.3 miles. Turn left onto Graham Ave/PA-160. Graham Ave is just past Jackson Ave. D'arc's Pizza Shop is on the corner.
