Carmichaels Area High School won 18th place at the 2018 NCF-Envirothon

A five-member team of high school students from Pennsylvania won 18th place at the 2018 NCF-Envirothon held at Idaho State University, Pocatello, ID. The NCF-Envirothon is an international environmental education competition for high schoolers conducted by the National Conservation Foundation (NCF) and supported by the National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD).

The top three overall scoring teams received cash prizes sponsored by Smithfield Foods, the world's largest pork producer and processor. The top fourth through tenth placing teams received cash prizes from Canon U.S.A., Inc. Other event sponsors included the National Association of Conservation Districts, the U.S.D.A. Natural Resources Conservation Service, and Sustainable Forestry Initiative, along with many partners from Idaho and across the country.

At this year's event, 43 high schools from the U.S., five from Canada, and two from China participated in the NCF-Envirothon.



2019 Pennsylvania Envirothon State Competition

The 2019 Pennsylvania Envirothon competition will be held at the University of Pittsburgh Johnstown, Cambria County on May 21 and 22.

The oral component will take place on Tuesday and the station testing on Wednesday. All events will be held on the UPJ campus.



UPJ is located in the city of Johnstown, 70 miles east of Pittsburgh. UPJ is a four-year, fully accredited, degree-granting, coeducational, residential undergraduate college, which was founded in 1927 as a regional campus of the University of Pittsburgh, one of the nation's oldest institutions of higher education.

Teams that have completed their oral presentations may want to make arrangements to visit the historical Johnstown Flood Museum or Inclined Plane. They may also join in on a pick-up game of basketball or soccer on the outdoor courts, or hike the UPJ nature trails.

2019 Current Environmental Issue

"Agriculture and the Environment: Knowledge and Technology to Feed the World"

There are many articles that estimate the population of the Earth to be approximately 9 billion by the year 2050. One of the primary concerns for the agricultural industry is how will farmers be able to grow enough food to feed this growing population, while also protecting natural resources such as soil, water, air, wildlife, and forestry resources.

Students will learn the concepts of how agriculture and all natural resource areas are interrelated, as well as how the use of new technologies is a key to increase food production.

Key topics will include:

- Understanding the importance of moving toward sustainable farming systems to conserve natural resources, mitigate climate change, reduce erosion and protect water quality and quantity, and promote pollination;
- Understanding the farming practices that build soil organic matter such as composting, crop rotations, cover crops, conservation tillage, and management intensive grazing systems to improve soil health;
- Understanding integrated pest management and biological pest control techniques used to prevent insect pest, disease, and weed problems; and
- Understanding the role of new technology: agricultural biotechnology, precision agriculture, and using UAV (drones, GIS, etc.) to increase farm efficiency for food production.



Pennsylvania Envirothon Scholarship Awards

The Pennsylvania Envirothon has been awarding educational scholarships now for 15 years. Since 2005, we have awarded \$146,000 to more than 230 students from 12 different counties. The scholarship program is supported by donations made by Pennsylvania's County Conservation Districts. Thanks to their generous donations, scholarship awards for the Pennsylvania Envirothon state competition are now extended to the top five teams.



Each student on the top five teams at the 2019 State Envirothon Competition will receive the following scholarship awards: First place - \$1,250; Second place - \$750; Third place - \$500; Fourth place - \$300; and Fifth place - \$150.

It is a goal of the Pennsylvania Envirothon to continue to recognize teams at the state competition. Thank you, conservation districts, for supporting the Pennsylvania Envirothon Scholarship program!
